I was intrigued to watch Beverly as she studied and focused on each individual quilt as a masterpiece. She would rate each quilt based upon various quilting standards and often took moments to teach. The comments she would make were thoughtful and meaningful to help each quilter learn from their quilting techniques. Lastly, she always made a positive comment about the quilt. There were times she was challenged in deciding who placed first, second, third and honorable mention because of the excellence she observed in the quilts. There is strength and beauty in each quilt.
