

West Broward Quilters Guild

We celebrated the history of our Guild in June with an overview of the history of the guild researched by Cathy Donn. Here is a summary of her research.

West Broward Quilters Guild, Inc. was founded in 1980 by 6 members. The guild officially registered with the Florida Division of Corporations in 1986 as a Florida Not For Profit Corporation. Sadly, we are pretty sure that none of the founding members are

still living, and no one I have been in touch with definitively knows who any of the founding members are. I do think that Sue Edwards, Ann Sapp and Betty Roberts might have been 3 of them. Susan Hochsztein, who joined the guild in 1984, and Sara Goldberg, who joined in the 1990's, are the two current members with the longest membership. The Guild held an annual quilt show for the first 9 years, skipped 1990, and the first Biennial Broward Quilt Expo put on by WBQG, Southern Stars and East Sunrise Quilt Guild was held on November 2nd - 3rd, 1991.

The guild met at many different places over the years, including the Davie Women's Club, 6551 Orange Dr.; Plantation Central Park, 9151 NW 2nd St.; Davie United Methodist Church, 1001 NW 70th Ave.; Jim Ward Community Center, 301 NW 46th Ave., Plantation; Lauderdale Yacht Club, 1725, SE 12 St, Fort Lauderdale, and our current location in the meeting room at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, 7601 SW 39th St., Davie. We are proud to be the first and oldest quilt guild in Broward County, and we appreciate everyone's membership and leadership for 44 years!

I was born in Connecticut, went to college there, and taught math there. The gym teacher was a driver for a female sports car racing team and asked me to be on her crew. 
